

Flood Timeline Posters

Materials: Bibles, one set of the 29 posters (pages 2–30 of this document), markers or crayons, yarn or ribbon to go with poster #13

Instructions:

1. Make two-person teams to work together on this activity.
2. Assign each poster to a two-person team in your class or family for them to create.
3. Have teams look up the verses to find out what picture goes on their poster. [The Teacher's Notes contain a Key that includes what each verse is describing written in red.]
4. Once the posters have been made, have each person hold his or her poster or line them up along one wall as a timeline.
5. Video record the timeline with each person reading the caption of their picture.
6. Display the recording so that all students can see the events in order (without being distracted by what they will say next).

Note: If your students are unable to help make the timeline, make the 29 posters yourself. Use the timeline to teach the events of the flood.

Write “10 Generations from Adam” in large, dark print.

Draw a picture of what God tells Noah to do in Genesis 6:14.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

3

Write “100 Years” in large, dark print.

4

Draw a picture of who went into the Ark in Genesis 7:7.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

5

Draw a picture of what God tells Noah to take in Genesis 7:2–3.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

6

Write "7 Days" in large, dark print.

7

Draw a picture of what God does in Genesis 7:16 once Noah, his family, and all the animals are in the ark.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

8

Draw what happened in Genesis 7:11 on the seventeenth day of the second month.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

9

Write "40 Days" in large, dark print.

10

Draw a picture of rain.

Write at the bottom how many days it rained according to Genesis 7:12.

11

Draw a picture of what Genesis 7:19–20 says happened as it continued to rain.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

12

Draw a picture of what Genesis 8:1 says God sent to help with the flood waters.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

13

Write "5 months" in large, thick print.

Tape your paper to a piece of ribbon or yarn that will stretch from poster #8 to poster #13. This page will lift above posters 8-13.

14

Draw a picture of what Genesis 8:4 says happened on the seventeenth day of the seventh month.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

15

Write “74 Days” in large, dark print.

16

Draw a picture of what Genesis 8:5 says Noah finally saw after about seventy-four days.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

17

Write “40 Days” in large, dark print.

18

Draw a picture of what Genesis 8:7 tells us Noah did after waiting forty days.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

19

Draw a picture of what Genesis 8:8 says Noah did.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

20

Write "7 Days" in large, dark print.

21

Draw a picture to show what Genesis 8:11 says happened the second time Noah sent out a dove.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

22

Write “7 Days” in large, dark print.

23

Draw a picture to show what Genesis 8:12 says happened when Noah sent out the dove the third time.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

24

Write "1 Month" in large, dark print.

25

Draw a picture to show what Genesis 8:13 says Noah did.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

26

Write “56 Days” in large, dark print.

27

Draw a picture of what Genesis 8:15-17 says God told Noah to do.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

28

Draw a picture to show what Genesis 8:20 says Noah did to honor God.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.

29

Draw a picture to show what Genesis 9:12–17 says God gives as a sign of His covenant promise.
Write a caption at the bottom that explains your picture.
